EMENTA (Course description)

Introductory remarks. Physical environment of Brazil. The historical formation of the country. Economic formations: agriculture, industrialization, trade and services. The socio-economic regionalization of Brazil – Northeast Brazil: the cultural heartland; South-east Brazil: the economic center; Northern Brazil: living close to nature, Central-western Brazil: agricultural expansion and frontiers; Southern Brazil: ethnic plurality and European influence. Brazilian cultures and diversity: indigenous, Africans and other immigrant groups in Brazil. Cultural contradictions: erudite vs. popular cultures. The political territory. International relations and policies. Field trip in Curitiba.

OBJETIVO GERAL (General educational goal)

- Students are expected to develop a general framework of knowledge concerning structures and problems of Brazil.

OBJETIVOS ESPECÍFICOS (Specific educational goals)

É a determinação do que se pretende que o estudante seja capaz de fazer (ou demonstrar que sabe fazer) ao término de um determinado tópico da aprendizagem. Seu desempenho deve ser observável e mensurável. Este tipo de objetivo é também chamado de objetivo comportamental ou objetivo de ensino.

- Students are expected to understand the regional structure and the dynamics of Brazilian landscapes/ecosystems.
- They are also expected to develop a comprehensive overview on the historical, economic and social dynamics of the country.
- Based on these general structures, students are expected to get acquainted to specific characteristics in different regions in Brazil.
- Finally, students should be able to contextualize their understandings with their own home country and/or with their home region in Brazil.
- One specific aspect is the comprehension of paradox globalization processes across borders, with reference to Brazil and/or the specific home countries.

PROCEDIMENTOS DIDÁTICOS (Requirements)

1. Active class participation through discussion, performance and debate is expected.
